**GENERAL PUBLISHED REASONS FOR DECISIONS ON APPEAL  
TRADITIONAL LINEFISH SECTOR  
FISHING RIGHT ALLOCATION PROCESS 2021/2022**

## **INTRODUCTION**

1. These are the General Published Reasons for the Decisions on appeal in the Traditional Linefish sector: 2021/2022 by the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (Minister). This document is titled the "*General Published Reasons for Decisions on Appeals in the Traditional Linefish Sector: 2021/2022*" (the Appeals GPR).
2. The Appeals GPR is structured as follows:
  - 2.1 Introduction;
  - 2.2 Decisions on Systematic/Cross cutting Grounds of Appeals;
  - 2.3 Quantum Allocation Methodology (QAM);
  - 2.4 Outcome of the Assessment;
  - 2.5 Conclusion; and
  - 2.6 The final allocation of commercial fishing rights in the Traditional Linefish sector is set out in **Annexure A** to the Appeals GPR.
3. Linefishing in South Africa is defined as the capture of fish with hook and line but excludes the use of longlines. The three sectors of the linefishery (commercial, recreational and small-scale) target between 95 and 200 of South Africa's 2 200 marine fish species. Species targeted in the linefishery display diverse life-history strategies, including many traits that cause these populations to be particularly vulnerable to over-fishing e.g., long lifespans (>20 years), estuarine-dependence, sex change and aggregating behaviour. Furthermore, many of the species are endemic to South Africa. Target species of the linefishery include temperate, reef-associated seabreams (e.g. roman, hottentot seabream, santer and slinger), coastal migrants (e.g. geelbek and dusky kob) and nomads (e.g. snoek and yellowtail). More than 90% of the current linefish catch is derived from the aforementioned eight species. Most of the linefish caught are not targeted exclusively by this fishery but form important components of the catch or the bycatch of other fisheries. Effective management of linefish resources that are shared among different fishery sectors can be complex.
4. The commercial linefishing sector is exclusively boat-based. The total number of registered vessels operating in this sector was estimated at 700 in the late 1990s, which accounted for 37% of all boats operating in marine fisheries in South Africa. Since 2006, a maximum commercial allocation

of 455 boats has been maintained; however, the number of boats allocated per zone has varied. Line-fishing is a low-earning, labour-intensive industry and therefore important from a human livelihood point of view. Employing an estimated 27% of all fishers, it has the lowest average employment income of all South African fisheries. Although the commercial linefishery has the largest fleet, it contributes to only 6% of the total estimated value of all South African marine fisheries.

5. After the introduction of the towable ski-boat in the late 1940s, the recreational boat-based sector expanded rapidly. Landings from this open-access recreational fishery are not reported throughout the region, and for some areas and species the total catch from this sector could be equivalent to that reported by the commercial sector. The recreational linefishery has by far the largest number of participants (>450 000) of all fishery sectors in South Africa and consequently has great economic value. This is especially important to coastal regions dependent on the tourist trade, but also to industries associated with the small craft, outboard motor, fishing tackle and bait trades.
6. During February 2022, the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (the Department) completed its process relating to the consideration of applications in the Fishing Rights Allocation Process of 2021/2022 (FRAP 2021/22), in the Traditional Linefish sector. The Chief Director: Aquaculture and Economic Development, Mr Belemane Semoli, in his capacity as the Delegated Authority in the Traditional Linefish sector, published his decisions in respect of the FRAP 2021/2022 in the "*General Published Reasons for the Decisions on the Allocation of 2021/22 Fishing Rights and Effort in the Traditional Linefish Sector*" (GPR).
7. Applicants who were dissatisfied with the Delegated Authority's decision were entitled to appeal against the decision(s) of the Delegated Authority, in terms of section 80 of the MLRA, read with regulation 5 of the Regulations to the MLRA, via the Department's FRAP Appeals online system. The closing date for FRAP 2021/2022 appeals was 29 April 2022. In response to several requests from the fishing industry, the closing date was extended to 29 July 2022. The Department received one hundred and seventy-eight (178) appeals in the Traditional Linefish sector across the different categories of applicants and across the different zones. One (1) appeal was submitted after the closing date for appeals.

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8. Appeals are governed by section 80 of the Marine Living Resources Act, 1998 (Act No. 18 of 1998) (MLRA) read with Regulation 5(3) of the Regulations to the MLRA, published under Government Notice R1111 in Government Gazette 19205, dated 2 September 1998.
9. This document addresses the issues raised in the appellants grounds of appeal, and it sets out how they were dealt with to determine and decide the appeals in general.
10. In making my decisions on the appeals that have been submitted against the FRAP 2021/2022, I considered and balanced a wide range of factors. These include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - 10.1 The principles and objectives derived from the Constitution that are relevant to the FRAP 2021/2022;
  - 10.2 The principles and objectives of the MLRA as stated in section 2 thereof;
  - 10.3 The purpose and objectives of the 2021 General Policy on the Allocation of Commercial Fishing Rights: 2021 (the 2021 General Policy) read with the various sector specific policies on the allocation of commercial fishing rights: 2021 (the Sector Specific Policies);
  - 10.4 The need to broaden access to the fishing industry, by introducing new entrants to the various fisheries;
  - 10.5 The need for transformation of the fishing industry to achieve equity and to address historical imbalances;
  - 10.6 The desirability of multi sector involvement, facilitating participation through the value chain;
  - 10.7 The need to minimise negative impacts on the fishing industry, including instability or disruption of existing participation in job creation, and minimising job losses;
  - 10.8 The need for sustainable development of the natural resource through, among other, the determination of the Total Allowable Catch (TAC) and Total Applied Effort (TAE);
  - 10.9 The need to address the dynamics of each specific fishery;
  - 10.10 The need to minimise the risk of paper quota holders;
  - 10.11 The adjustments that need to be made where related entities have applied for rights in the sectors;
  - 10.12 The need to assess applicants within a category against other applicants in the same category so that new entrants are not unfairly prejudiced on certain criteria where existing right holders may score higher;

- 10.13 The desirability of giving successful applicants a reasonable prospect of active and meaningful participation in the fishery
- 10.14 The Constitutional Court judgment in the matter of *Bato Star (Pty) Ltd v Minister of Environmental Affairs and Tourism and Others (CCT 27/03) [2004] ZACC*, which provides important guidelines for me to consider when I exercise my duties as the Minister responsible for the affairs of the Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment (the Department).
11. In arriving at my decisions, I also had regard to the following considerations:
- 11.1 The General Policy on the Allocation of Commercial Fishing Rights 2021 (General Policy) is a guideline document on the allocation and granting of commercial fishing in terms of section 18 of the MLRA. The granting of rights for the Traditional Linefish Sector will be guided by the 2021 General Policy on the Allocation and Management of Commercial fishing rights, read with the Sector Specific Policy on the Allocation and Management of Commercial Fishing Rights in the Traditional Linefish sector: 2021 (the Sector Specific Policy).
- 11.2 The 2021 General Policy and the Sector Specific Policy are based on, among other, the Constitution, the MLRA, the Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003) (BBBEEA), the National Empowerment Fund Act, 1998 (Act No 105 of 1998) (NEFA), the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000 (Act No 3 of 2000), the Promotion of Access to Information Act, 2000 (Act No 2 of 2000), and the Protection of Personal Information Act, 2013 (Act No. 4 of 2013) (POPI).
- 11.3 The 2021 General Policy and the Sector Specific Policy give effect to the objectives of the MLRA as listed in Section 2 thereof. The objectives identified in section 2 of the MLRA are the following:
- (a) *The need to achieve optimum utilisation and ecologically sustainable development of marine living resources;*
  - (b) *the need to conserve marine living resources for both present and future generations;*
  - (c) *the need to apply precautionary approaches in respect of the management and development of marine living resources;*
  - (d) *the need to utilise marine living resources to achieve economic growth, human resource development, capacity building within fisheries and mariculture branches,*

*employment creation and a sound ecological balance consistent with the development objectives of the national government;*

- (e) the need to protect the ecosystem as a whole, including species which are not targeted for exploitation;*
- (f) the need to preserve marine biodiversity;*
- (g) the need to minimise marine pollution;*
- (h) the need to achieve to the extent practicable a broad and accountable participation in the decision-making processes provided for in this Act;*
- (i) any relevant obligation of the national government or the Republic in terms of any international agreement or applicable rule of international law; and*
- (j) the need to restructure the fishing industry to address historical imbalances and to achieve equity within all branches of the fishing industry."*

11.4 The objective of transformation of the fishing industry is a constitutional and legislative imperative. The primary vehicle for the promotion of the transformation of the South African fishing industry is the MLRA. Therefore, in exercising any power under the MLRA, regard must be given to the stipulated objectives and principles set out in section 2 of the MLRA with measures to achieve the objective to restructure the fishing industry, to address historical imbalances and to achieve equity within the fishing industry.

11.5 The assessment of appeals is undertaken per the different categories of applicants recognised, to ensure that new entrants are not prejudiced when compared to existing rights holders. Those applicants who held rights in the fishery for which they are re-applying during the period 2006 to 2020 are considered as Category A Applicants. Applicants who held rights in sectors other than the fishery they are applying for during the period 2006 to 2020 are considered as Category B Applicants. Applicants who did not hold commercial fishing rights during the period 2006 to 2020 are considered as Category C Applicants. Category B and C applicants are also referred to as "new entrant" applicants.

12. In determining each of the appeals, I considered all relevant factors and the information before me, including but not limited to:

12.1 The Marine Living Resources Act, 1998 (Act No 18 of 1998);

12.2 The Regulations in terms of the Marine Living Resources Act;

- 12.3 The Policy for the Allocation and Management of Commercial Fishing Rights in the Commercial Traditional Linefish Sector: 2021;
  - 12.4 General Policy on the Allocation of Commercial Fishing Rights: 2021;
  - 12.5 The FRAP applications;
  - 12.6 The Delegated Authority's GPR dated 28 February 2022;
  - 12.7 The Delegated Authority's decision letters;
  - 12.8 The Appeal forms;
  - 12.9 Regulation 5 (3) reports; and
  - 12.10 Relevant case law
13. Where necessary and appropriate, the Appeals GPR refers to individual appeals. However, the Appeals GPR does not respond to each appeal and to every allegation by individual appellants made therein. Where appropriate and necessary, specific grounds of appeals which are not addressed in the Appeals GPR, are dealt with in the individual appeal decisions that will be sent to appellants.
14. Each appellant in the sector will receive the following documents:
- 14.1 The individual Appeal Decision and the full reasons for such decision;
  - 14.2 Where applicable, a copy of the adjusted score sheet on appeal;
  - 14.3 A letter incorporating the appellants score on appeal and indicating whether the appellant will be granted a commercial fishing right in the Traditional Linefish sector; and
  - 14.4 The Appeals GPR.
15. The Appeals GPR is final. However, the allocation of fishing rights is subject to the correctness of the assertions made and information submitted by the applicants / appellants, and performance reviews. If any information in the online application or online appeal process are found not to be true or complete, or if false information is provided, or material information is not disclosed, this may lead to the revocation, suspension, cancellation, alteration or reduction, in terms of section 28 of the Marine Living Resources Act, 1998 (Act No. 18 of 1998) (MLRA), of any right, license or permit granted on the strength of the Fishing Right Allocation Process 2021/2022 (FRAP 2021/2022) application or appeal.

## SYSTEMATIC/CROSS CUTTING GROUNDS OF APPEAL

### Mechanical and/or Formalistic Approach

16. Whilst compliance with the various policies is couched in strict terms, in considering the appeals, I also had regard to the current legal position which provides that these policies serve as a guide to decision-making and cannot bind the decision-maker inflexibly.
17. In this regard, I was guided by the Constitutional Court's judgement in the case of *Bato Star Fishing (Pty) Ltd v Minister of Environmental Affairs*<sup>1</sup> where the court held that an approach to procedural fairness requires that policy not be applied rigidly and inflexibly.
18. Accordingly, in considering the appeals, I overruled any mechanical or formalistic application of the various policies and instead, I evaluated the appeals in a flexible manner with consideration of the particular circumstances that apply to each of the appellants.
19. In addition, some of the appeals illustrated that mistakes were made in the assessment of the applications either as a result of the improper completion of the application forms, or the improper consideration of information on the Departmental database. In most of these instances, the Delegated Authority flagged such inconsistencies and recommended that these grounds of appeal should succeed.

### Effective Utilisation

20. In many instances, applicants were unsuccessful in the application process as a result of non-performance, or a failure obtain the required permits.
21. Previous right holders were expected to have landed at least 3 tonnes of Linefish for every full fishing season that they were active or a cumulative catch of  $\geq 18$  tonnes over the period 2014 to 2020 and/or to have activated a catch permit for 3 or more years .

22. The Sector Policy records Effective Utilisation as an exclusionary criterion and whilst there is a valid rationale for this requirement, the unique circumstances of appellants cannot be discounted.
23. Appellants detailed the various challenges they encountered in meeting the Effective Utilisation criteria. The appellants were unable to perform as a result of a lack of access to financial resources to enable them to obtain or repair equipment needed to perform. Appellants detailed the various attempts made by them to try and access resources to enable them to perform and explained the many challenges faced in this regard. The explanations provided were reasonable, cogent and acceptable.
24. Accordingly, the approach adopted on this ground was to consider the explanations provided by the Appellant in light of the particular challenges to appellants and where a reasonable explanation was provided, a flexible approach was adopted, and non-compliance was condoned.
25. Effective Utilisation remained an important consideration and the appeals were considered on a case-by-case basis.

#### Improper Lodgement Criteria

26. In some instances, applications were rejected as a result of a failure of applicants to provide material information like an identity document or valid tax certificate.
27. Whilst the General Policy provides that improper lodgement criteria will result in the exclusion of an application, I was guided by the legal requirement that I apply the policy in a flexible manner. I accordingly considered the circumstances of appellants, including, among other, access to the online application system.
28. Consequently, in circumstances where the required information was in existence at the time of an application and/or reasonable explanations for the non-submission were provided, the improper lodgement criteria was condoned.

Suitability of Vessels

29. A significant number of applicants nominated the same vessel. The requirements of a suitable vessel are set out in the Sector-Specific Policy.

30. Clause 9.1 of the Sector-Specific Policy reads as follows:

*"A suitable vessel in the Commercial Traditional Linefishery is a trailerable "skiboat" type vessel or a traditional replacement "chuckie" type vessel that*

- (a) Has a maximum SAMSA overall length (LOA) not more than 10 meters and is registered for not more than 12 seafarers. Larger displacement-hull vessels (deckboats) with overnighting capacity and sleeping accommodation will be considered if they have been used by the applicant in the commercial linefish sector in the past.*
- (b) Is certified by SAMSA with an expiry date not later than 2019, to have an operational range not exceeding 40 nautical miles.*
- (c) Has a functioning vessel monitoring system, at the time of applying for a vessel license if the application is successful.*
- (d) Is equipped to hold fish on ice.*
- (e) Is a commercial linefishing vessel and cannot be used as a luxury yacht, a recreational vessel or recreational charter vessel, once registered as commercial fishing vessel.*
- (f) Is, if it enters the fishery for the first time, rigged out specifically for Commercial Traditional Linefishing."*

31. Vessels that did not comply with these requirements were correctly found by the Delegated Authority not to be suitable and points were allocated to these applicants based on the suitability demonstrated.

32. In certain instances, applicants who did not nominate a suitable vessel were excluded based on being a paper quota risk. This is in line with clause 6.4.1(e) of the General Policy which stipulates that an applicant will be considered a paper quota risk and may be excluded if they will not catch and land any fish.

FRAP online system

33. Appellant's alleged that they could not upload certain information on the FRAP online system. In instances where the appellant could not upload information on the FRAP online system, and that information was in existence before 31 January 2022 such information was accepted and considered by me on appeal.

Defective Applications

34. Further instances that resulted in unsuccessful applications, arose as a result of incomplete application forms or incorrectly completed application forms. Some appellants alleged that they are not well-educated or that they are not tech- savvy. Whilst the FRAP system is an efficient way of dealing with the applications, I took cognisance that for many applicants the online FRAP system presented an additional challenge as these appellants do not have easy access to technology, are not tech savvy and do not necessarily understand the nuanced requirements of an online application system.
35. Thus, whilst the General Policy has specific requirements regarding lodgement criteria and material defects, these criteria had to be considered in the context of the particular circumstances of the applicants set out above.
36. Therefore, instances of improper lodgement and/or materially defective applications were considered with the understanding of the nuances applicable to appellants and a flexible approach was adopted in this regard.
37. The above list is not exhaustive, but a summary of the general issues raised by appellants on appeal.
38. In this Appeals GPR, I address overarching issues that apply to several of the appeals as categorised above. My individual Appeal Decisions should in each instance be read with this Appeals GPR for wider context.

## QUANTUM ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY (QAM)

39. I have considered all the information and documentation that were placed before me during the appeals process.

40. The following allocation methodology was used by the Delegated Authority:

40.1 The TAE for the Traditional Linefish is set at a maximum of 455 standard vessels, divided between the regions in the manner set out below.

40.2 The TAE per zone is apportioned between the Small-Scale sector and the Traditional Commercial Linefish sector.

40.3 A standard vessel is defined as a vessel that can carry a crew of 7, with a maximum length overall of 10 meters and a maximum crewing capacity of 12, including the skipper.

40.4 Maximum standard vessel allocation for the three Management Zones were as follows:

Zone (s)	Number of Vessels
A: Port Nolloth to Cape Infanta	340
B: Cape Infanta to Port St Johns	64
C: KwaZulu-Natal	51

41. Only five percent (5%) of the allocated TAE was reserved for appeals. The unallocated portion of the reserved TAE, if any, after appeals, will be allocated to the Small-Scale Fishing Sector. The TAE reserved per zone is as follows; Zone A = 9; Zone B = 2; Zone C: 1.

42. The Delegated Authority allocated rights as follows:

### **Zone A**

**Category A:** All Category A applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category B:** All Category B applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category C:** All Category C applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Zone B**

**Category A:** All Category A applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category B:** All Category B applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category C:** All Category C transferee applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Zone C**

**Category A:** All Category A applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category B:** All Category B applicants that met the criteria were successful.

**Category C:** All Category C transferee applicants that met the criteria were successful.

43. The Delegated Authority's decisions were informed by the General and Sector Specific Policies. In particular paragraph 8 of the Sector Specific Policy notes that there is limited room to accommodate new entrants, noting the large number of applications that were received in this sector. It also notes that the apportionment of small scale and commercial fishing in all three zones, within the TAE of 455 standard vessels, necessitated that the Delegated Authority adopt the allocation scheme per zone as set out above. I confirm that this allocation scheme is also adopted on appeal, which provides for rights to be allocated to existing right holders if successful and to new entrants who are successful only thereafter, where the availability of TAE permits such allocations. The portion of the TAE which has been set aside for successful appellants is unfortunately not enough to cater for all the appellants who are successful on appeal.
44. In effect, this means that all Category A applicant/appellants who are successful will be granted a portion of the available TAE . All Category B applicants/appellants who are successful will be then granted a portion commensurate with the remainder of the TAE available for both Category B and C applicants . Category C applicants will be granted a right subject to availability of TAE in the relevant zone concerned.
45. I note that applicants who were granted rights in terms of section 21 of the MLRA (transferee applicants) were treated as Category C applicants where they obtained rights after 28 February 2018.

46. Albeit that transferee applicants were categorized as Category C applicants (new entrants) in the Delegated Authority's GPR, I assessed them as Category A applicants, but for the assessment of fishing performance in the event that they had obtained a rights transfer after the cut-off date of 28 February 2018. There was thus no prejudice to Category C applicants. Accordingly, I have kept them under Category C for purposes of this Appeals GPR.
47. To ensure that successful right holders are rightful participants in the sector, I have directed the Deputy Director: Fisheries Management to instruct the forensic investigators appointed in relation to the FRAP 2021/2022 process, Morar Incorporated, to undertake a forensic investigation into the accuracy of the information provided by applicants/appellants in categories B and C of this sector. In the event that any information by any applicant is found to be untruthful/fraudulent, the Department will be entitled to invoke the provisions of section 28 of the MLRA. This is required to ensure that rights are granted and utilized for the purpose intended for under the MLRA and the Sector Specific Policy.

#### **OUTCOMES OF THE APPEALS**

48. There was a total of 178 appeals in this sector. Below is an overview of the outcome of the appeals:

##### **48.1 Zone A**

###### Category A

- 31 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal.
- 14 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.
- 2 Appellants successfully applied to have their vessel changes approved on appeal.
- 2 Appellants were successful in terms of the DA's decision, but their appeals were unsuccessful. They remain successful applicants in terms of the DA's decision.

###### Category B

- 5 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal.
- 1 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.
- 2 Appellants were successful in terms of the DA's decision, but their appeals were unsuccessful. They remain successful applicants in terms of the DA's decision

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Category C

- 5 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal.
- 63 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.
- 1 Appellant was successful in terms of the DA's decision, but his appeal was unsuccessful. He remains a successful applicant in terms of the DA's decision.
- 2 Appellants successfully applied to have their allocated zones by the DA changed on appeal.

**48.2 Zone B**

Category A

- 4 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal.
- 4 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.

Category B

- There were no appeals in category B.

Category C

- 2 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal but remain unsuccessful due to the unavailability of TAE in this zone.
- 15 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.
- 7 Appellants were unsuccessful on appeal. Remain unsuccessful in terms of the DA's decision.
- 1 Appellant was successful in terms of the DA's decision, but his appeal was unsuccessful. He remains a successful applicant in terms of the DA's decision.
- 1 Appellant was successful in terms of the DA's decision, he appealed his categorization, I have upheld his appeal but he remains as a Category C applicant.

### 48.3 **Zone C**

#### Category A

- 2 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal.
- 2 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.

#### Category B

- There were no appeals in category B.

#### Category C

- 3 Appellants successfully overturned their exclusions on appeal but remain unsuccessful due to the unavailability of TAE in this zone.
- 3 Appellants were unsuccessful, and their exclusions were confirmed.
- 6 Appellants were unsuccessful in terms of the DA's decision, their appeals were unsuccessful. They remain a successful applicant in terms of the DA's decision.

49. At the conclusion of the appeal process, 86% of Category A applicant/appellants were successful in their application/appeals; 85% of Category B applicants/appellants were successful and 21% of Category C applicants/appellants were successful in their applications/appeals

### **TAE Allocations**

50. The final TAE allocations in the Traditional Linefish sector are as follows:

#### 50.1 Zone A

DA Allocation: 236; Appeals Allocation: 45, leaving 59 for Small Scale vessels

#### 50.2 Zone B

DA Allocation: 46; Appeals Allocation: 6, leaving 12 for Small Scale vessels

#### 50.3 Zone C

DA Allocation 43; Appeal Allocation: 2, leaving 6 for Small Scale vessels



51. The final list of commercial fishing rights holders in the Traditional Linefish sector is set out in **Annexure A**.

### **CONCLUSION**

52. Section 80 of the MLRA deems me to be the Appeal Authority over decisions of the Delegated Authority and I have wide appeal powers in terms thereof. I have the power on appeal to award fishing rights, and to overturn the decisions of the Delegated Authority to allocate rights, including decisions related to TAC and TAE, where such decision-making is rationale, fair and in line with the provisions of the MLRA and specific policies.
53. Should any appellant be dissatisfied with any aspect of my decision(s), it may apply to a competent court to have this decision judicially reviewed. Judicial review proceedings must be instituted within 180 days of notification hereof, in accordance with the provisions of section 7 of the Promotion of Administrative Justice Act, 2000 (Act No. 3 of 2000) (PAJA).
